ROBIN HOOD FOUNDATION

- The hope breakfast project is done under the child headed household banner and is specifically aimed at orphaned and vulnerable children.
- This project tries to inspire hope, after the devastation they have suffered, through volunteer interaction and support with necessities. The robin hood foundation, with the assistance of community liaisons, take orphaned children on a day of shopping to purchase school uniforms, toiletries and stationary.
- The children are then treated to a meal and sent home with their school goodies, a hamper full of food, towels, blankets and a toy. KZN slots took this a step further and funded ten grade 1 scholars for the duration of 2017 academic year, ensuring that not only do they have their school uniform and stationary, but that their home has the basic food needs met.

South Coast Hospice

South Coast Hospice enables patients and their loved ones to have control over their lives so that they may live with dignity and hope during the time of their terminal illness and loss. Care is given in the patient's own home, backed up by their Palliative Care Support Centre and Local Health Facilities. KZN slots assisted by purchasing air-conditioners and computers, as well as a diagnostic machine and mattress covers for their kingfisher unit. The memory box project is one that pulled at our heartstrings.

This orphaned and vulnerable children's programme encourages children that are infected and affected by HIV/AIDS to preserve their memories in a box, thereby enhancing their resilience and improving their ability to cope with adversities that they face on a daily basis.

The students at the golden steps school touched our hearts and we were blessed to experience their positivity and laughter. This school's curriculum aims to empower it's learners with self-confidence and the much needed skills to eventually become contributing citizens of the community thus enabling them to take their rightful place in society. Many of these learners are non-verbal and KZN slots assisted the school with the purchase of two iPads with the proloque'2 software, as well as smart TV. These devices are pivotal in developing value systems, social interaction skills and shaping the behaviour of learners, as well as giving them a voice to express themselves and communicate with those around them. Lungisisa Indlela Village (LIV village).

One of our projects in 2013 was Lungisisa Indlela Village (LIV village). LIV is an organization that is situated in Cottonlands, verulam that takes care of orphaned children, providing support through life skills training at schools, after care support for children at risk, and family crisis support through an aids crisis home. We contributed R152 385-87 towards the purchasing of fridges, mattresses and bed linen for the cottages.



CSI KINGDOM SLOTS

In 2015, 2016 and 2017, Kingdomslots contributed R133 719, R103 615 and R100 000 respectively to child welfare Durban and district's back to school project. (Cwdd). CWDD provides for the needs of orphan, abandoned, HIV infected and street children. Their back to school project involves the purchasing of school uniforms, stationary, school lunches for the children placed in their child and youth centres.

- Kingdomslots contributed R140 000 and R95 000 to Umthombo youth development foundation in 2016 and 2017 respectively. The foundation identifies, trains and supports youth in their quest to become qualified healthcare professionals as a way of addressing staff shortages at rural hospitals.
- This includes comprehensive mentoring and financial support throughout the course of their studies, as well as assistance with integration into the hospital working environment once qualified.
- The foundation was granted the funding for mentoring of students.

STEPS

STEPS is a charity is a National non-profit organisation working for the eradication of clubfoot as a disability in southern and east Africa. After successful treatment by Dr Ponseti in Iowa, USA, Karen Moss returned home and told the story of her son's successful treatment to local doctors. Karen founded STEPS in 2005 to introduce and promote the Ponseti method of clubfoot treatment in Southern Africa and support families going through the process.

The Ponseti method involves the stretching the ankle and foot through gentle manipulation and the casting of the foot and leg. The cast is then left on for five to seven days to hold the correction achieved and allow the baby's ligaments and tendons to soften into the new position.

Following correction, the congenital condition that caused the clubfoot deformity in the first place tends to stay active and the foot can sometimes relapse. To prevent recurrence, when the last plaster cast is removed a foot abduction brace must be worn full-time, usually for three months and thereafter at night until four years of age. Kingdomslots contributed R119 127 towards the purchase of new braces

CASME

- Over 600 teachers from primary schools in the Umlazi districts will be supported by the Kingdomslots donation of R108,000. The teachers have demonstrated high levels of commitment to their professional development and participation in the training provided which ensured their place in the programme.
- The project encourages interest and enthusiasm by learners through the staging of a series of mathematics competitions. These competitions are organised at two levels, the first being at school level followed by an inter-school competition. The best performing learners in the project will be awarded prizes at a ceremony during November.
- The centre was established in 1985 and is a well-recognised and respected education development organisation with a long history in the development and delivery of school maths and science interventions in South Africa.
